

- ▶ People lived in tribal (**clan**) groups.
- ▶ Each tribe (clan) was **ruled** by a **chief**, **king** or **queen**.

- ▶ Most of the **1 million people**, who lived in Iron Age Britain either lived inside hillforts or in **small villages** close to a hillfort.





